WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

Matthew 15:27-28 (ceb)

27 She said, "Yes, Lord. But even the dogs eat the crumbs that fall off their masters' table."
28 Jesus answered, "Woman, you have great faith. It will be just as you wish." And right then her daughter was healed.

Greetings, siblings in Christ!

You all know me well enough by now to know that I want to keep challenging us in our faith and our journey towards holiness through Christ. In that, I light up when I find a new (to me) theological concept that leads me to rethink things I was already sure of.

One of the concepts that has strengthened my beliefs in the past few years comes out of Womanist Theology. Womanist Theology, if you don't know, is theology particularly shaped and practiced by African American women, born from their experience of life and faith and God. The concept that I have come to greatly treasure (especially given my passion for space sharing in the church) is that new understandings and experiences of God come out of the lived experience of the community. This says to me that when we allow our community to become new (through the God who is making all things new), we will also get a new and broadened experience of God. We'll talk more about this in November, as we explore together Dr. Wilda Gafney's book *Womanist Midrash*, which will also set the stage for a powerful book study to start the new year, but more on that later.

If you know anyone who desires to broaden their understanding and experience of God, invite them to church in November. If you know someone who might like to hear a different perspective on a Sunday, invite them THIS SUNDAY, when Chloe Ward will be bringing us the message, and I hope to see you all there.


