WORLD COMUNION SUNDAY OCTOBER 5



This Sunday, we will celebrate the unity and diversity of the universal Christian community with World Communion Sunday. As we gather around the Lord's table, we recognize our unity in Christ, joining with others worldwide in Holy Communion. Embracing this commitment, United Methodists are dedicated to nurturing diverse leadership within the church by allocating funds for scholarships and leadership training for under-represented students. Contributions fund scholarships for U.S. and international students, as well as grants for global inclusion, diversity, equity, and access training.

MESSAGE FROM THE SAFETY COMMITTEE

Believe it or not, cold weather is coming. Just a few reminders on how to protect yourself, your family and friends from the usual flu bugs and cold viruses. If you are sick, please stay at home until symptoms are resolving; this helps decrease spread of viruses to others and helps protect all of us. Wear a mask when in crowds, especially if you have a serious medical issue. Wash your hands frequently and use alcohol based hand cleansers. Try to make it a habit to wash your hands the first thing when you return home. This helps decrease bacteria/viruses that you may have been exposed to. Ideally, washing hands for 20 seconds is best. Avoid crowds when flu/covid infection rates are high. Masking can help decrease exposure and spread. Lastly and probably most importantly, get your flu vaccination. These really do help, especially at preventing hospitalizations for flu related symptoms. You might still get the flu, but it will not be as severe and will keep you out of the hospital. Especially for folks 65 and over, the vaccination will decrease the severity of symptoms. The recommendations are for you to receive a "quadrivalent, high dose vaccination". These are readily available and provide better protection against the flu. As we age, our immune systems don't work as well and the high dose vaccination helps boost the immune system's response and give better/longer protection. Also, think about a covid vaccination along with a flu shot. The current Covid shot protects against the latest mutations of the virus that are spreading in the community. Covid is not going away and this shot can protect us from exposure and slow the spread to others. Hope this is helpful and that we all enjoy a healthy winter.
